<u>Divert</u> plastics from landfills at a quality suitable for approved end markets (recycling or energy recovery)

## An End-of-Life Solution for Hard-to-Recycle Plastics



Plastics are converted into valuable resources



Orange bags are baled and sent to suitable end markets





Orange bags are picked up by regular haulers along with other recyclables.



Orange bags are sent to participating materials recovery facilities.
