THIS EVENING'S SPEAKER

The Honourable Lawrence Cannon, Minister of Transport, Infrastructure and Communities

Lawrence Cannon is a first-time Member of Parliament and was elected to the House of Commons in 2006.

Between 2001 and 2005, Mr. Cannon served as a city councillor in Gatineau. He was appointed president of the Société de transport de l'Outaouais in 2002 and in 2004 he was named president of the Association du transport urbain du Québec.



Mr. Cannon's political involvement at the city level was preceded by a brief period when he was a consultant in the private sector.

He was a member of Quebec's National Assembly from 1985 to 1994. Mr. Cannon held the posts of Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly and Minister of Communications in Premier Bourassa's government.

Mr. Cannon holds a Bachelor of Arts in political science from l'Université de Montréal and a master's in business administration from l'Université Laval.



THE MASTER OF CEREMONIES

Rob MacIsaac, Chair, Greater Toronto Transportation Authority

As the first Chair of the Greater Toronto Transportation Authority (GTTA), Rob MacIsaac is responsible for leading a Board of Directors to plan, prioritize and integrate transportation systems across the Greater Toronto Area and Hamilton.



During his term as Mayor of the

City of Burlington, Mr. MacIsaac became well-known for his regional approach and progressive growth management ideas for the Greater Golden Horseshoe.

As a member of the Ontario Smart Growth Panel, he led the effort to develop a vision and recommendations for a Smart Growth Strategy for Central Ontario. These elements remain fundamental tenets in the Province's Places to Grow Plan.

Subsequent to this work, Mr. MacIsaac chaired a provincial task force that established the founding principles for a permanent Greenbelt for the Greater Golden Horseshoe. The Greenbelt Plan preserves more than 1.8 million acres of forest, natural lands and farmlands in one of the most populous regions in the country. In May 2004, he accepted the Canadian Urban Institute's Urban Leadership Award on behalf of the Task Force.

POULUTION PROBE'S TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMME

Pollution Probe's Transportation Programme was established to find solutions to the environmental impacts associated with transportation activities in Canada. Whether traveling by plane, ship, train, truck or automobile, the burning of fossil



fuels to power our vehicles — both large and small — creates emissions that can pollute the air we breathe and contribute to changes in the earth's climate system.

As Canada's population has increased and the amount of personal and commercial traffic has swelled, emissions from the transportation sector have increased steadily. Today, one-quarter of Canada's greenhouse gas emissions come from transportation sources, including road vehicles, air travel and marine. Half of this amount is from personal vehicles alone (cars, minivans, pickups and SUVs). Transportation is also a sector that is projected to be impacted by climate change, with the opening of the Northwest Passage and lower water levels in the Great Lakes.

There has been a rapid rise in greenhouse gas emissions from the movement of goods and freight in Canada. The Climate Change and Transportation Programmes at Pollution Probe are organizing a national conference in the New Year to review the factors driving these emissions trends and to identify the actions needed. New emissions standards for trucks are also being phased in to reduce air pollutants,



and the voluntary agreement between the Railway Association of Canada and the Government of Canada to monitor and reduce locomotive emissions has been renewed. Pollution Probe sits on both the Management and Technical Review Committees to this agreement.

To reduce emissions from personal vehicles, Pollution Probe's Motor Vehicle Fuel Efficiency Project has been working to support the establishment of national fuel efficiency standards, along with a comprehensive package of complementary measures to increase consumer demand for fuel efficient vehicles. Pollution Probe has also partnered with the Canadian Automobile Association on a new Eco-Mobility Plan in support of programmes that enable drivers to take action, conserve fuel and reduce emissions.

To further reduce emissions from personal vehicles, Pollution Probe will continue to support cleaner commuting options in the Greater Toronto Area by advocating for improved public funding for public transit and for Smart Growth, and through campaigns such as the annual Clean Air Commute[™].


