Dwight Duncan was first elected to the Ontario legislature in 1995, and was re-elected in 1999, 2003 and 2007.

Duncan previously served as Minister of Energy and Chair of Cabinet, Minister of Finance and Chair of Management Board of Cabinet, as well as Government House Leader. As Minister of Energy, Duncan brought meaningful change to Ontario's electricity sector, fostering a culture of conservation, while ensuring a reliable, sustainable, diverse and affordable power supply.

Duncan is a lifelong resident of Windsor. From 1987 to 1995, Duncan served as an administrator at Brentwood Recovery Centre, Canada's largest alcohol and drug recovery centre. He sat on Windsor City Council from 1988 to 1994.

A graduate of McGill University and the University of Windsor, Duncan has degrees in economics and commerce, as well as a MBA. He has one son, Sean.

Gordon M. Nixon
President and Chief Executive

Gordon Nixon began his career in 1979 at Dominion Securities where he worked in Global Markets and the Investment Banking division. In 1986, he transferred to Tokyo to assume responsibility for the firm's operations in Japan. In 1995, Mr. Nixon was appointed head of Global Investment Banking and in 1999 became Chief Executive officer of RBC Capital Markets. He was appointed President of Royal Bank of Canada on April 1, 2001 and Chief Executive Officer on August 1, 2001.



Mr. Nixon is Chairman of the Canadian Council of Chief Executives, and is on the Board of Directors of The Hospital for Sick Children, the International Monetary Conference and MaRS Discovery District for which he will become Chairman in 2009. He is also on the Canadian Advisory Boards of Daimler/Chrysler, Catalyst and Queen's University School of Business.

In 2007 Mr. Nixon was invested into the Order of Ontario and was the recipient of Canada's Outstanding CEO of the Year Award. He has an Honorary Doctor of Laws from Queen's University, and among other honours, is a recipient of the CIJA/UJA Words and Deeds Leadership Award and an American Banker Innovator of the Year Award. Mr. Nixon attended Queen's University where he received an Honours Bachelor of Commerce degree. He and his wife live in Toronto and have three children.

TRIBUTE TO KEN OGILVIE...

Ken Ogilvie **Executive Director Emeritus,** **Pollution Probe**

Ken joined Pollution Probe in October 1995, as Air Director, to build a long-term, comprehensive air programme. The programme is currently being implemented with several components including: smog/particulate controls; air toxics reductions; greenhouse gas reductions; and further acid rain controls to protect sensitive aquatic ecosystems. In 1996, Ken took on the position of Executive Director. Under his direction, Pollution Probe has developed considerably over the past 12 years. Ken worked to enhance Pollution Probe's capacity to promote effective environmental policy — nationally and regionally — and to research issues and communicate them effectively to the public.



Prior to working at Pollution Probe, Ken served for two years as the Executive Coordinator of the Ontario Round Table on Environment and Economy. He has also worked for Environment Canada and the Manitoba Department of Environment. He has been actively involved in environmental standards-setting work, especially the ISO 14000 series of environmental management. He is currently on several Boards, including Sustainable Development Technology Canada, BIOCAP Canada, The Institute for Environmental Innovation and the Canadian Standards Association.

Ken's academic credentials include a Bachelors of Applied Science (Civil Engineering), University of Waterloo and a Masters of Business Administration, York University.

Bob Oliver **Executive Director,** **Pollution Probe**

Bob was most recently the Director of Pollution Probe's Transportation Programme. In this position he worked effectively to support the development of policies and programmes to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from transportation activity in Canada. He also focused on the potential for alternative fuels and transportation infrastructure to contribute to reducing emissions of air pollutants

and greenhouse gases. In addition, Bob was instrumental in building a collaborative partnership between the Canadian Automobile Association (CAA) and Pollution Probe to promote "eco-mobility" — a plan to reduce automobile emissions that views the driver, the vehicle and the road as part of an integrated system.

Bob was appointed to the position of Executive Director on June 13, 2008. He takes over from Executive Director Emeritus, Ken Ogilvie, who led Pollution Probe since 1996 and further solidified the organization's reputation as a leading environmental NGO. Bob is committed to building upon the achievements of Ken and scores of Pollution Probe staff who, since our founding in 1969, have served the public good and that of the environment.

Before joining Pollution Probe, Bob worked at Marbek Resource Consultants in Ottawa. Bob holds a Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering from Carleton University, and brings fifteen years experience managing industrial projects and developing strategies for energy efficiency and greenhouse gas emissions reductions.
