MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Welcome to the 2009 Pollution Probe Gala Dinner! Tonight's theme, "The Big Switch", implies a transition from what was to what will be, and it was inspired by the significant transformations that our guest speaker, Mr. George Smitherman, has put into motion in Ontario's electricity sector. But in addition to the 'switching on' of green power in the province, our theme holds special meaning for Pollution Probe's Board of Directors



and staff. In 2009, after many years of faithful service as Chair of the Board, Ed Babin announced that he was stepping down; shortly thereafter, Ian Morton agreed to take on the role. I completed my first year as Executive Director in 2009, and no less than half of the current permanent and contract staff joined Pollution Probe just this year. It certainly signals a new beginning. That this year also marks the 40th anniversary of Pollution Probe's founding by faculty and students at the University of Toronto in 1969, seems to punctuate the 'big switch' underway in the organization, as well as my sense of electricity and excitement for tonight's Gala Dinner.

Among many recent developments at Pollution Probe, I am very pleased to announce that new Energy Systems and Chemicals Management programs have been initiated, as well as special projects to achieve environmental improvement through the deployment of integrated community energy systems, consumerfocused strategies based on market research, and environmental data mapping of watersheds. Our transportation program also continues to expand, with new projects and partnerships on freight movement and electric vehicles, in addition to our ongoing work on personal automobiles and commuter mode-shifting. Going forward, our focus will be on developing integrated solutions to complex environmental challenges, and the building of non-traditional partnerships needed to address them.

It is with great respect and gratitude that I also welcome one of Pollution Probe's founding members to be our Master of Ceremonies: Monte Hummel, President Emeritus of World Wildlife Fund Canada and one of Pollution Probe's first executive directors, has graciously accepted our invitation to act as host tonight.

I would like to extend a special thank you to our sponsors and to all of you for joining us tonight. It is your generous support that will help us bring about the change to which this evening is dedicated!

THE MASTER OF CEREMONIES

Monte Hummel President Emeritus, World Wildlife Fund Canada

As a young boy, Monte Hummel moved to Whitedog Falls where his father worked in a hydro camp in the bush, north of Kenora, in northwestern Ontario. Ten years after leaving, he revisited his home river to discover it had been contaminated with mercury, leaving the Ojibway community there in social and economic despair. This personal experience led to a lifelong career of environmental advocacy.



In 1969, Monte co-founded Pollution Probe of which he eventually became Executive Director and later Chairman. Between 1977–82, he also co-ordinated the undergraduate program in Environmental Studies at the University of Toronto.

In 1978, he joined World Wildlife Fund Canada as Executive Director, later to become President. During his leadership, WWF helped downlist thirty wildlife species from Canada's official Species at Risk list, and through WWF's Endangered Spaces campaign, over 1000 new parks and wilderness areas were designated, doubling the amount of protected area in Canada. After 26 years as executive head of WWF-Canada, Monte became President Emeritus in 2004. He remains active daily on the organization's boreal forest and Arctic conservation files.

Monte has two grown children, Robin and Doug, and when he is not on the road, at his desk, or hiking and canoeing from his cabin at Loon Lake, he lives quietly in the country with his wife Sherry Pettigrew near the small town of Beeton, Ontario.





THE EVENING'S SPEAKER

George Smitherman MPP, Toronto Centre

George Smitherman is the former Deputy Premier of Ontario and Minister of Energy and Infrastructure. He is currently MPP, Toronto Centre. He was first elected in downtown Toronto in 1999, but his interest in politics was sown 20 years earlier. Inspired by Pierre Trudeau, he gained experience at all three levels of government, working with several senior political leaders.



From his home base in Toronto's gay community, where he owned a small business for nearly a decade, Smitherman launched his campaign for public office. He is Ontario's first openly gay MPP and cabinet minister. In the community, Smitherman is well known for his advocacy in areas such as housing, community economic development, protection of pension rights, efforts to combat guns and drugs, and human rights issues.


Prior to being Minister of Energy and Infrastructure, Smitherman acted as Ontario's longest serving Minister of Health and Long-Term Care in the past quarter century.
